2 Click on the link for eBooks:



3 Click “Sign In” in the upper right hand corner of the page. Type in “Pauline Haass” and select your library, and then enter the barcode number on your library card (including all letters) and PIN/password (for most cardholders, this is your date of birth in one of the following formats: MM/DD/YYYY or MMDDYYYY).

4 If this is your first time signing in, set your default loan periods (either 7, 14, or 21 days for eBooks) by clicking on “Account” and then “Settings.” Be sure to click “Done” to save your settings when you are finished.

5 Search for titles or authors in the search bar, or click “Menu” to browse. Narrow your results to show Kindle eBooks: click the “Format” facet on the left side of your screen, then click “Kindle Book.”



6 Click on the covers or titles to see more details. If a book is available, you can check it out by clicking “Borrow.” If the item is unavailable, you can place it on hold. You will then be emailed when it is available for checkout.

7 Once you have borrowed the book, click “Download” and select the Kindle format, then click “Confirm and Download,” which will bring you to Amazon’s website.



Click on this link to download the library’s Kindle eBook. You will be prompted to provide your Amazon account info. From here, you can have the title sent via Wi-Fi to your Kindle or transfer it with a USB cord.

The title will expire on its own, so you don’t have to worry about late fees! You must still delete the file after it expires.
